Service Officer's Report

Comrades All,

Where does the time go? It is fall already and I am just getting used to writing 2008 on my correspondence and soon I will have to reprogram my brain to accept 2009.

This past summer has been very busy. Last May Veterans Affairs sponsored a very memorable trip to Halifax, which I was part of, to commemorate the "Battle of the Atlantic". That was the longest fought battle of W.W.2, starting with the torpedoing of the passenger liner the Athena on September 3, 1939, off the coast of Ireland, ending August 19, 1945. Canada's first casualty of the war was a Canadian woman, a member of the crew. Canada's Merchant Navy alone lost 72 ships with more ten percent casualties. One of the largest of any service. The Royal Canadian navy lost 23 ships plus 7 Motor Torpedo Boats with a large loss of life.

These are only Canadian losses; the British Merchant Navy lost 2177 ships plus 30132 men. Norway with only a population of approximately four million people lost nearly six hundred ships. The United States and other allied nations lost several hundred more and the list goes on. Prime Minister Winston Churchill said it was the only battle he was afraid of losing. The whole world depended on the Merchant Navy.

In June, several of us attended, as delegates, the Royal Canadian Legion Convention in the beautiful city of Ottawa. These conventions are all business, very educational and the comradeship plus the hospitality make these conventions well worth attending.

There is Approximately 234,000 active Service Veterans currently alive and only 62,000 are on the Veterans Independent Program, which proves to me that many have fallen through the cracks. Even if you were not overseas and served in the Canadian Forces, I urge you to apply. If you were denied due to a means test, re-apply for hearing loss, as a hearing loss could have started due to military service caused by gun fire, engine noise, altitude sudden change in aircrafts etc. Give it a try. They can only say yes or no.

In the last three months, two Veterans have been accepted and one is being processed... None of these Veterans were overseas. You do not have to be a Legion member to apply although we have two new members because of the help they received.

This is my report and I want to remind everyone their pledge especially the new and younger members, please help with the Poppy Campaign



