### Treasurers Report

Unfortunately, at the time of publishing, November data was the most current final period available to discuss for this report, leaving what appears to be a good month of December to be presented at a later date. On the positive, November 2008 is the mid point of our year and provides some very good insight on the Branch activity. I will address the specifics of our financial situation later in this report. First however, as a not-for-profit entity, it is any Branch's responsibility to manage both their income and expenses to ensure that their Branch remains viable in that it is able to cover all the costs involved in running the Branch, but at the same time manage the prices being charged to the members for the services provided by the Branch to ensure a fair return for all active members. An alternative to this comment is that both too much and not enough profit essentially presents the same problem for any Branch. Contingencies have to be accounted for when planning both income and expenses for any year. The building has to be maintained and eventually all equipment will have to be replaced. Branch 614 has a building that is in relative terms 'in good shape' but the age of the building combined with the age of

most of the equipment states the undeniable fact that repairs and replacements are upon us each year. Planning or budgeting for these major repairs and equipment purchases are only possible when allowed for over an extended period of time to minimize the impact to any fiscal period. And this is only possible when the Branch is able to set aside the necessary contingencies out of their annual operations. Where do we stand at the mid-point of this current business year? To date through November we have realized a decrease in gross operating profit of approximately 17.5% as compared to the same period last year. The greatest portion of this decrease can be found in the hall rental and functions. This matter is self explanatory. With functions down there is a significant impact on our revenue streams. The remainder of the financial report leaves little to discuss in the running of the Branch. The Bar Sales combined with the associated costs and the Operating Expenses year over year show minimal change. It would not be reasonable to suggest that cost cutting in either of these areas is possible as we are running very lean right now. To summarize, Branch 614 is tracking to a modest bottom line for the end of this fiscal period, whether it is positive or negative. The modest bottom line results in little or no contingency for the year, and in fact signifies that the reserve account that we currently have may be necessary to maintain only to cover potential short falls in annual operations.



